

# GOLF ACADEMY NOTABLES

## **Young A Yang -**

*LPGA Tour; 93rd on 2005 money list; Class of '98*

- In 2003, best finish of her rookie season was a tie for sixth at the McDonald's LPGA Championship Presented by AIG; carded a career-low 64 during the second round of the Wendy's Championship for Children at Tartan Fields, where she tied for 24th
- In May 2002, turned professional; tied for 21st at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn exempt status for the 2003 season

## **Paula Marti -**

*LPGA Tour; 118th on the 2005 money list; Class of '99*

- In 2003, best finish tied for 12th at the Weetabix Women's British Open
- In 2002, won the Australian LPGA Tournament of Champions; won the LET Order of Merit; tied for second at the Weetabix Women's British Open, an LPGA major championship, following four-straight rounds in the 60's; was a member of the European Solheim Cup Team; tied for 31st at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 2003 season
- In 2001, won twice on the LET: La Perla Italian Open and the Kellogg's All Bran Ladies British Masters presented by the Daily Telegraph
- In September 2000, turned professional
